- Lettuce Feed You, an actual source of hot food and meals--just west of the dining room in the basement. Generally open 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. but sometimes longer if the Legislature is in session...

Arturo's Mexican Restaurant, 105 S.E. 10th Ave. — locally owned Mexican restaurant open for lunch and dinner.





Who's in charge here? – That's the big question for the session, and surprisingly, it isn't the last-term

Democrat Gov. Laura Kelly, or even the solidoverride chamber chief Senate President Ty Masterson, R-Andover.

 Nope, it's new House Speaker Dan Hawkins, R-Wichita, whose tiny veto override majority is going to decide just who is

really in control of the state. It's his 85 GOP members whom he has to keep in line in order to override Kelly bill vetoes (needs 84 votes). Might be weeks ahead, but we're looking for that first override vote – maybe a GOP-crafted tax bill, or Medicaid expansion, abortion restrictions or maybe what is essentially school choice that will determine just who's running this show...

And, nope, House rules don't appear to give Hawkins the power to take the underground parking space from Republicans who vote to support a gubernatorial veto, or even just wear a distinctive wrist band...

Orange House badges – No, they're blue, the badges that House members wear to identify themselves in the Statehouse, but with the demolition/reconstruction of the Docking State Office Building just across the street, and turning a parking lot into a new state office building, those orange badges might be a good way for the public to identify lawmakers, and not just those folks who still have the name badge on from last night's lobbyist-sponsored drinking party...

GOP should have no problems overriding gubernatorial vetoes.

The big issue, of course, is taxes. Speed up the roughly \$500 million cost of eliminating sales taxes on groceries, diapers and feminine hygiene products, and school supplies as the governor wants, or concentrating on income taxes for Kansans and corporations? The split-up? Probably enough sales tax cuts to make nice headlines, but the income tax proposals now being talked about range from a flat tax on all Kansans to subtly paring taxes on upper-middle class wage-earners. And, of course, business/industry puts its tax cuts in terms of economic development and general statewide prosperity, which is generally favored by folks who need jobs or need to keep their jobs, and the business owners.

The other issues are complicated for lawmakers this session. Fully funding K-12 education is always near the top, but efforts to spread that state funding to assist private schools are a GOP key, and paring – or at least double-checking – welfare, unemployment and Medicaid.

Oh, and don't forget legislative pay...the current \$88 a day is about the lowest in the nation and lawmakers are interested/anxious about it. It's probably time for a pay raise, but it has to be done this year – not in an election-year session – where it would be the headline on incumbent-challengers' palm cards. Stay tuned...
